





## Sewing Lounge Information & Supply List:

Sewtopia recommends you bring a very basic sewing kit for your projects. Below are the items that we suggest attendees bring:

- Thread (<u>Aurifil</u> will be providing one spool of thread to each attendee, this is just in case you need more)
- Pins
- Seam Ripper
- Marking pens/pencil
- Fabric Scissors
- Travel Size Ruler (Sewtopia will have a standard 24x6 ½ rulers for general use)
- Rotary Cutter (Sewtopia will have a couple of 45mm rotary cutters available for general use)
- Small Cutting Mat suggested size 12x18 (Sewtopia will have a couple of cutting stations for general use)

Sewtopia Sewing Lounge will have 6 to 8 ironing & cutting stations. Each station will have a large mat with a standard ruler and rotary cutter. Each ironing station will have a <u>Reliable</u> Sensor Velocity V200 iron and <u>Soak</u> Flatter Smoothing Spray.

Officially, the Sewing Lounge will open at 6:00PM on Thursday night, attendees can choose their permanent seats after at this time The Sewing Lounge will be made up of 20 tables that seat up to 4. <u>Bernina staff</u> will be on hand to help you setup if you're registered for a <u>Bernina 350PE Machine</u>. If you brought you own machine, and there's a Bernina machine at your spot, the Bernina staff will move it for you. Don't worry about packing your items up every night, Sewtopia staff will make sure the room is locked every night and reopen in the morning at 8am

## Instructors & Class Information



Elizabeth Hartman is a self-taught quilter from Portland, Oregon. She has been making things all her life but, after her first *(admittedly disastrous)* attempt at making a quilt, she was hooked and has been making quilts ever since.

In 2009, she left her corporate job to concentrate on quilting full-time. Since then, she has become known for her unique, modern quilt patterns and her popular blog, <u>ohfransson.com</u>.

Elizabeth Hartman is the author of the bestselling book, <u>The Practical Guide to</u> <u>Patchwork</u>, which won a 2011 Next Generation Indie Book Award. Her second book, <u>Modern Patchwork</u>, was released in May 2012. Her third book, <u>Patchwork City</u> was released in November 2014. She have been has also been featured in a variety of other books, publications, and media, including: Stitch, Quilt Scene, Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting,Patchwork Tsushin, and Quilting Arts TV. In 2014, Elizabeth started selling wholesale print patterns. More recently, she joined the Robert Kaufman Fabrics as a fabric designer and her new line Rhoda Ruth, will be shipping in Fall 2015.

A former graphic designer and graduate of Rhode Island School of Design, Denyse Schmidt has changed the way we think about quilts. Intrigued by the rich historical nature of quilts and inspired by beauty born of necessity, Denyse adds her distinctive aesthetic sensibility – clean, spare lines, rich color and bold graphics – to this rich art form.

Though firmly rooted in the techniques of American quilt-making, Denyse Schmidt is renowned for her fresh, offbeat approach to design and color and has won acclaim from the worlds of art, design and craft. As author of <u>Denyse Schmidt Quilts</u> (Chronicle Books, 2005) and <u>Modern Quilts</u>, Traditional Inspiration (STC Craft, 2012); fabric designer for <u>FreeSpirit</u> and Fabric Traditions; and teacher of a series of popular improvisational patchwork piecing workshops; Denyse continues to inspire with her witty take on tradition. <u>Denyse's studio</u> is located in a historic factory building in Bridgeport, Connecticut.

As a watercolorist, a letterer and a texture explorer, she gets lost in her studio for hours making art that she and her clients both love. Living in Los Angeles, she spends most of her time designing for magazines, fabric, greeting cards, wall art and more.

We will highlight her new line <u>Sunnyside</u>. This line was inspired by sand, sun, and sea! This is Sara's first collection and debuted in June 2015.

<u>Victoria Johnson</u> is an English artist living in Rome. After graduating with a degree in textile design, she was offered a job as a print designer in Manhattan. She stayed in New York for twelve years, eventually, co-owning and running a design studio. Those years spent designing for womenswear were hugely influential. Victoria's work features very feminine, wearable colour palettes, a broad variety of techniques, and even when whimsical it has a 'grown-up' quality and appeal.

We will highlight her new line <u>Whisper</u>. This line features butterflies floating among painterly, collaged florals. This is Victoria's first collection and debuted in February 2015.



She realized at that moment that the most beautiful architecture, in her mind, are the places where real people love to live, call home, each with his and her own story. She draws inspiration from the neighborhoods and cities she visits and lives in.

We will highlight her new line <u>Neighborhood</u>. This line features her lille huset dollhouses that she designed a few years back. This is Alyson's first collection and it debuted in January 2016.
